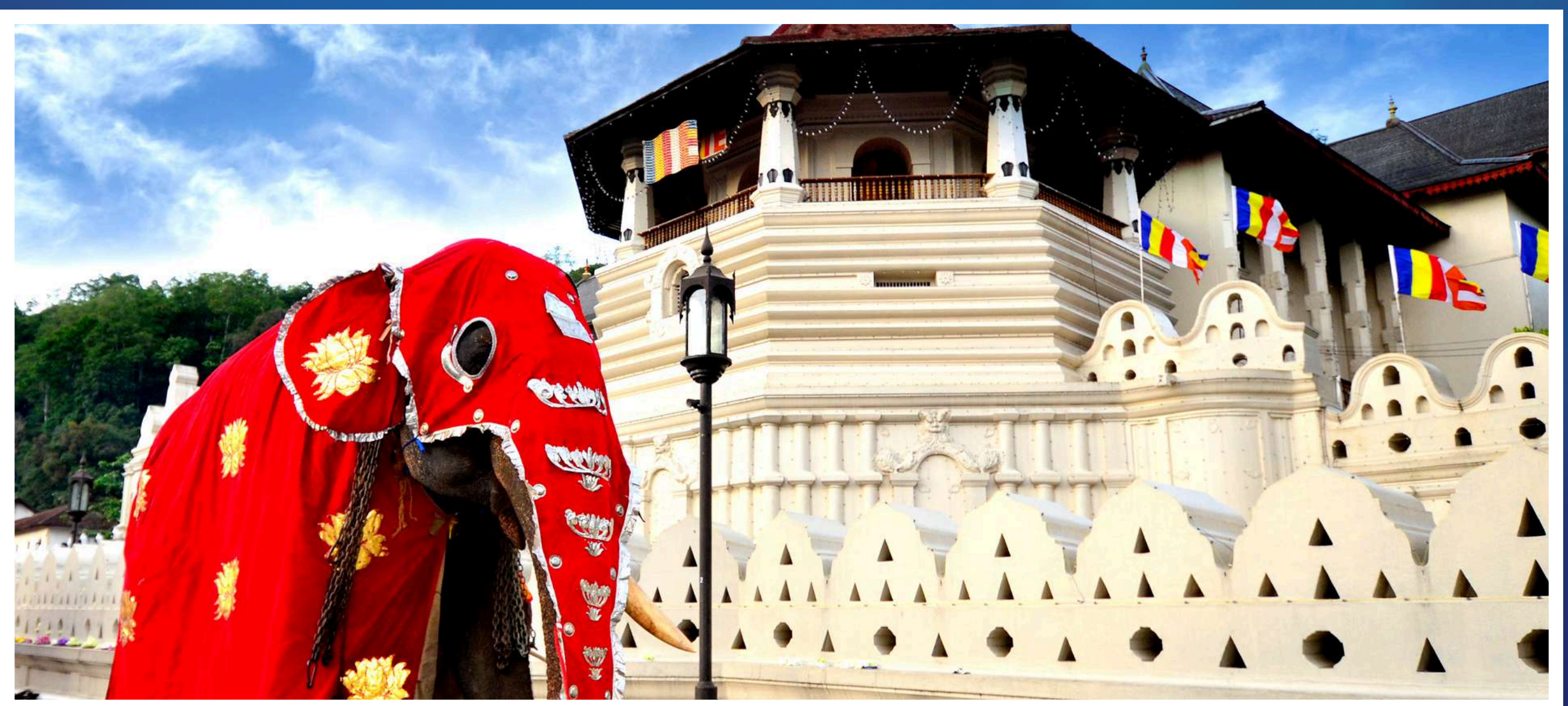

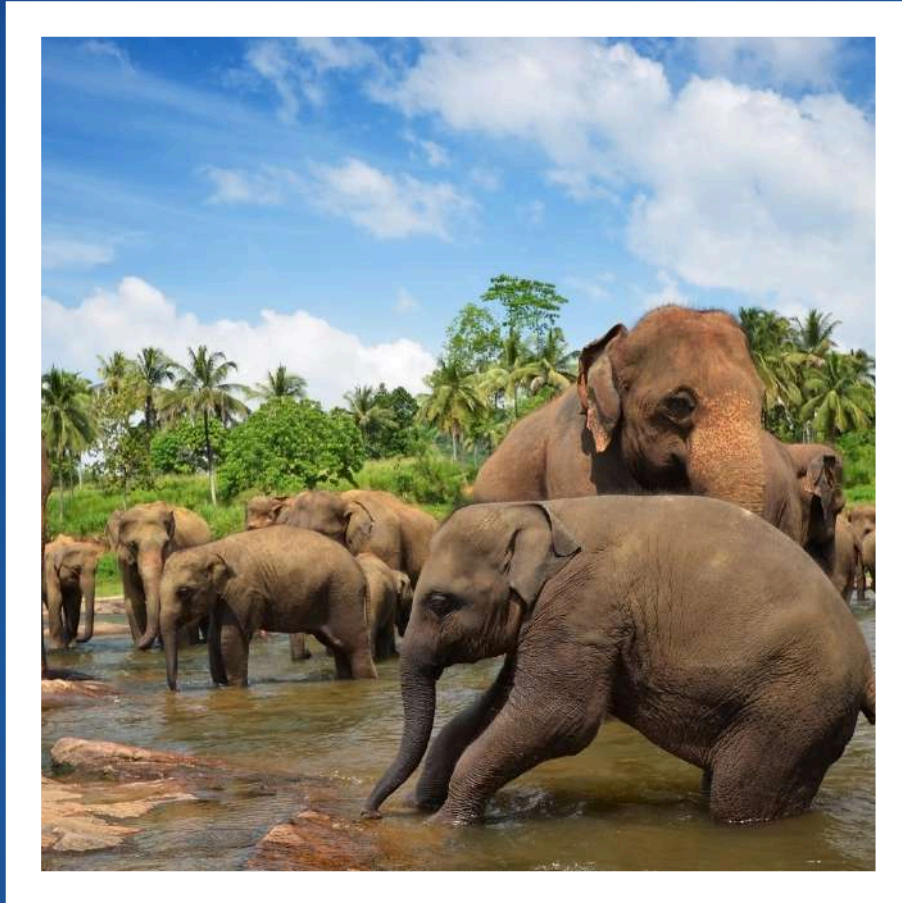
### Kandy Day Tour

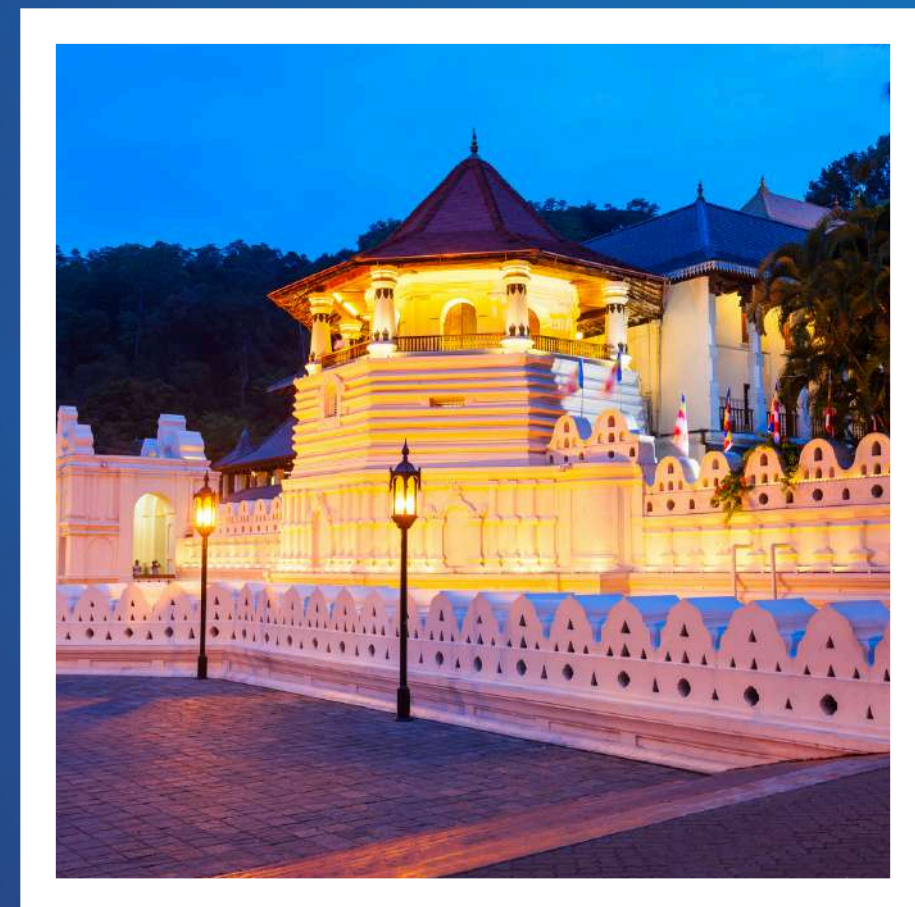
# Tour Highlights

## Pinnawala Elephant Orphanage



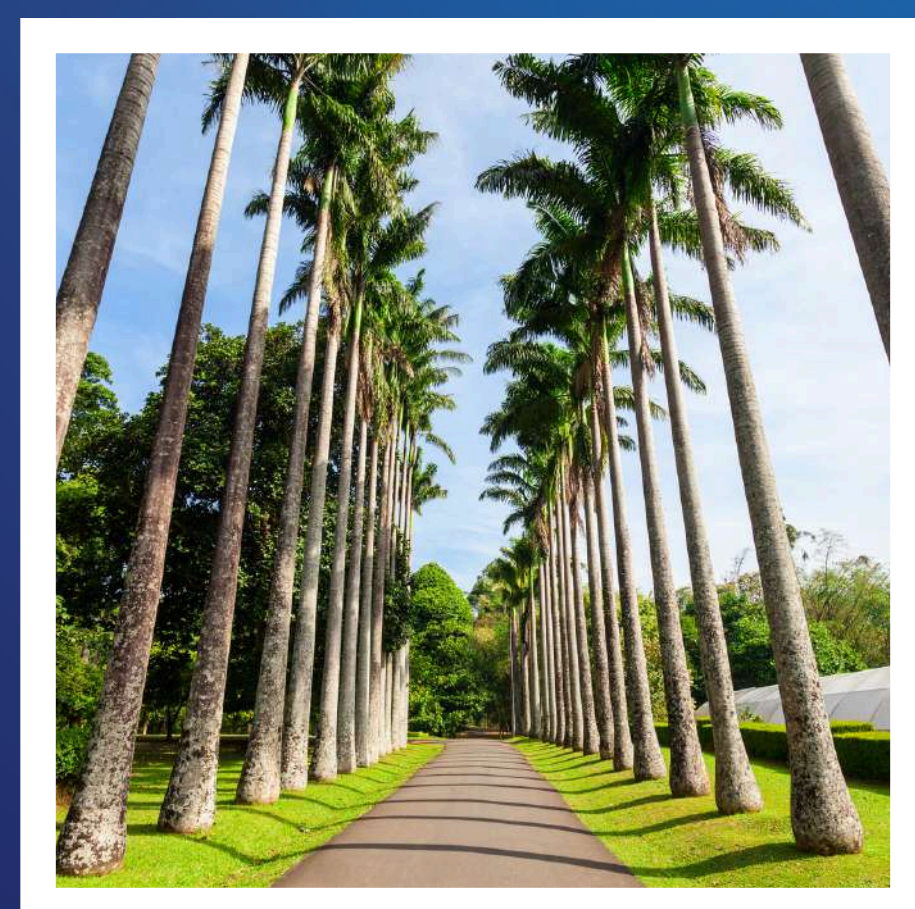

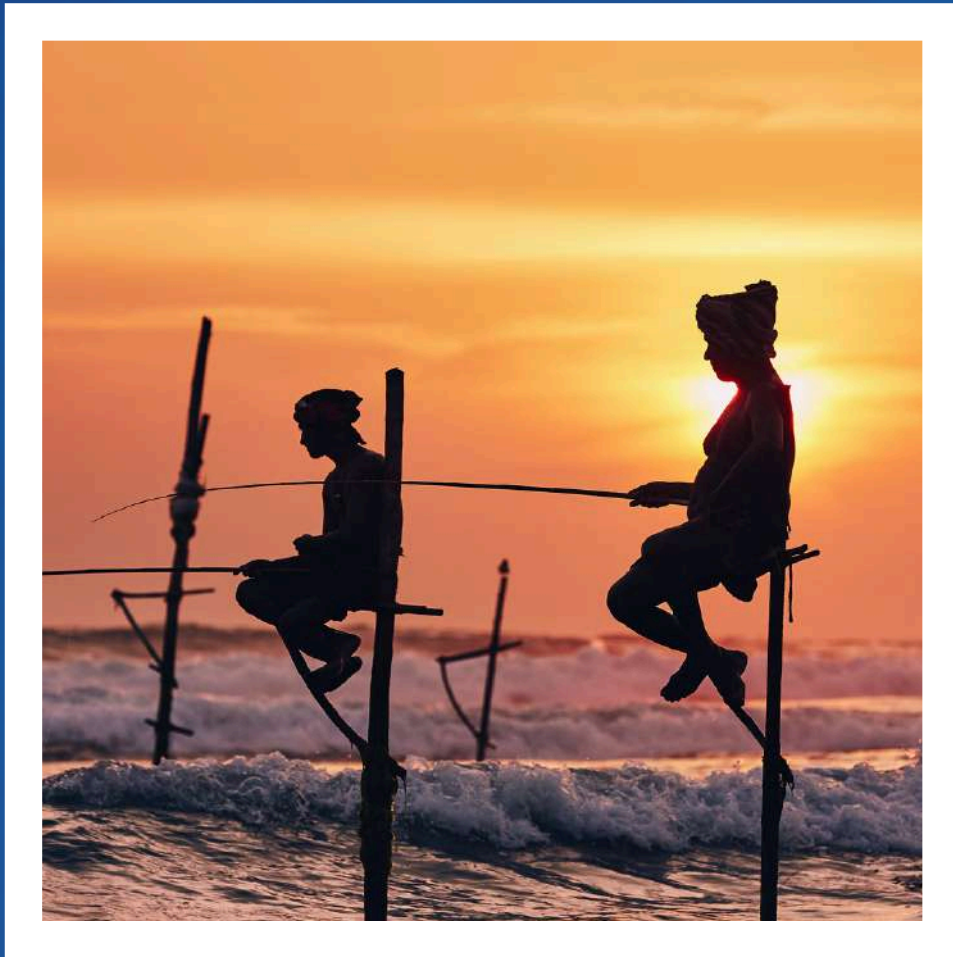
# Galle Day Tour

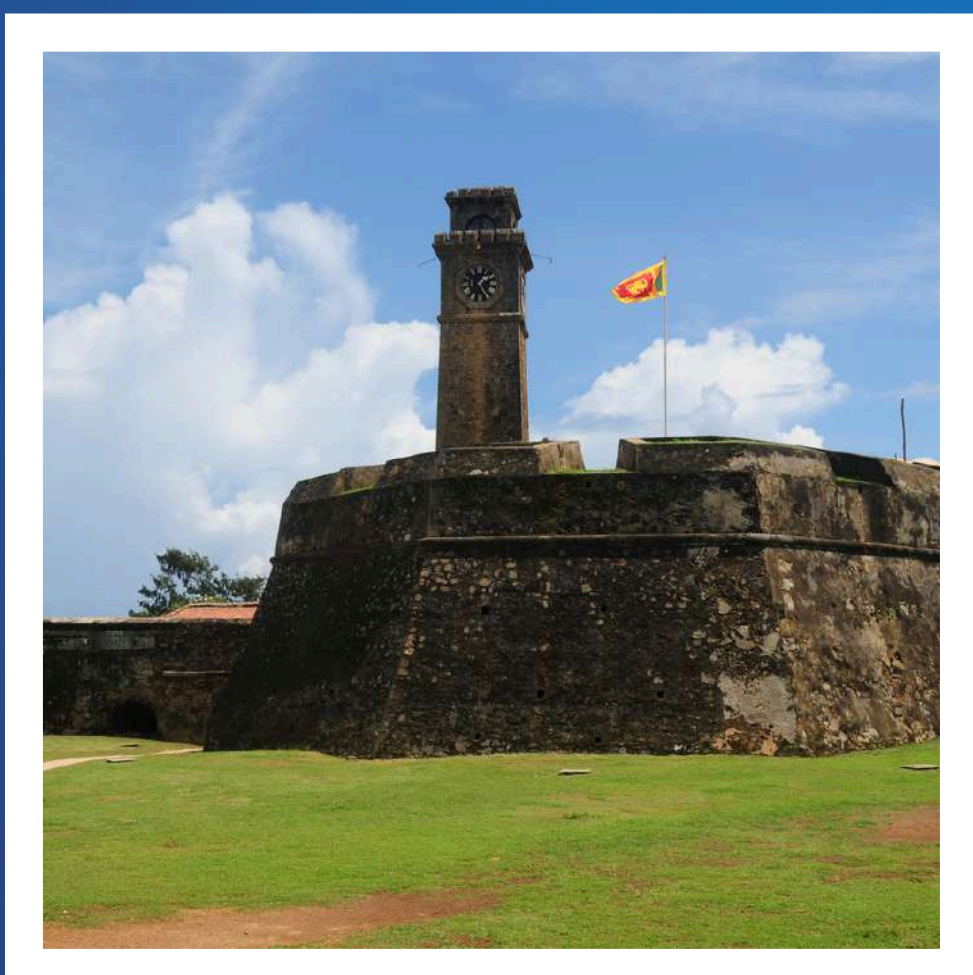
## Tour Highlights

### Stilt Fishing – A Traditional Sri Lankan Practice in Ahangama



Experience stilt fishing, one of Sri Lanka's most iconic and ancient fishing techniques, still practiced along the southern coast in Koggala, Weligama, and Ahangama. Fishermen balance skillfully on wooden stilts planted in the shallow waters, using simple rods to catch herring and mackerel. This centuries-old tradition, passed down through generations, is a fascinating glimpse into Sri Lanka's fishing heritage. Though less common today, stilt fishing remains a symbol of cultural identity, offering a picturesque sight against the backdrop of the Indian Ocean.

### Galle Fort – A Walk-Through History



Step into the best-preserved colonial fort in South Asia, the magnificent Galle Fort. This UNESCO World Heritage Site was originally built by the Portuguese in the 16th century, further fortified by the Dutch in the 18th century, and later taken over by the British in 1796. Enter through the main gate, where the British royal crest adorns the outer wall, while the VOC (Dutch East India Company) symbol is engraved on the inner walls.

Explore the fort's iconic landmarks such as the clock tower, the Old Dutch Hospital - now a vibrant shopping and dining complex, the Dutch Reformed Church showcases the stunning colonial architecture, the Maritime Museum, preserving the region's naval history and many more antique shops, mosques, and historic colonial buildings

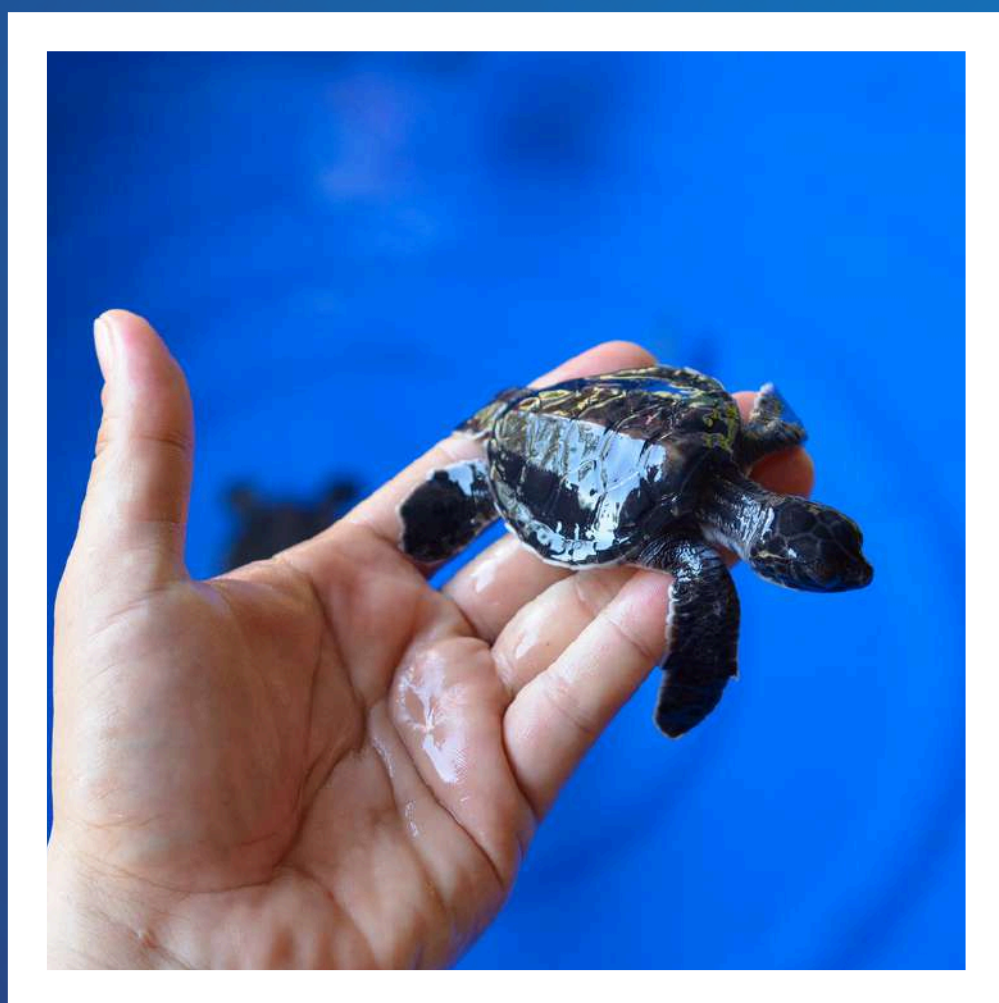

## Madu River Boat Safari



Embark on a scenic boat ride along the Madu River, gliding through a lush landscape of mangrove forests, winding water tunnels, and diverse wildlife. This 900-hectare wetland ecosystem, with 64 islands, is a protected Ramsar wetland site, home to a variety of birds, fish, and other aquatic species. The boat ride offers a chance to experience Sri Lanka's unique biodiversity, explore small islands, and witness traditional fishing and cinnamon cultivation. It's a perfect escape into nature's tranquility.

## Kosgoda Turtle Hatchery



Visit the Kosgoda Turtle Hatchery, a conservation center dedicated to the protection of endangered sea turtles. This rescue and rehabilitation project helps safeguard turtle eggs, nurture hatchlings, and release them into the ocean. Visitors can learn about different turtle species, see baby turtles up close, and even participate in a hatchling release. The hatchery also cares for injured turtles, helping to preserve Sri Lanka's rich marine biodiversity while raising awareness about ocean conservation.
